The team here at WOMAD NZ understand that sometimes participating in festivals can be an information overload! That's why each artist group has been assigned an Artist Minder who will be your personal support person during your time in Taranaki. Your Artist Minder will keep you updated on information, arrange transport for you and your instruments to and from the site, answer any general questions and assist you with your performance.

The contact information for your Artist Minder is in your personal itinerary in this pack.

REMEMBER: Your Artist Minder is a volunteer, who has freely given their time to support you (and us) during WOMAD. Please respect them. Any additional requests beyond their chaperone duty for your performance are at the minder's discretion.

Got Questions?

We will have a WOMAD Artist Info Desk throughout the event for any questions regarding transportation, shuttles, freight and general enquiries about Taranaki.

TRANSPORTATION

YOU MUST BE ON SITE 1 HOUR BEFORE YOUR PERFORMANCE!

Artist Shuttle Bus

We have artist shuttles running to and from the event throughout the WOMAD weekend. The shuttle schedule is attached. Please view this schedule in advance, as you **MUST** be on site 1 hour before your performance! Your Artist Minder will meet you at the reception of your hotel and chaperone you to the site. Make sure to discuss with your Artist Minder what time you will meet at your hotel reception and be ready with your things to board the shuttle on time. If you have significant amounts of instruments or gear, please contact Leigh Gatward Cook at the WOMAD Artist Info Desk in advance.

Note: Your Artist Minder is only required to chaperone you to and from the venue for your performance time. Any additional requests are made at the minder's discretion.

Once you've arrived on site

Your Artist Minder will guide you to your stage. If you require mobility assistance, please let your minder know well in advance.

The shuttle service is available for artists throughout the event. Your Artist Pass is your bus ticket so please show this to the driver as you hop on.

EQUIPMENT & INSTRUMENT

Before your performance

Your gear will be transported daily via the shuttle bus from your hotel to the festival site (see above). Please speak to your Artist Minder to discuss arrangements for this to ensure your instruments arrive in plenty of time for your performance.

If you have large amounts of instruments or gear, please contact Leigh Gatward Cook as soon as possible at the WOMAD Artist Info Desk located at the Quality Hotel Plymouth International. You will be advised on special arrangements to get your gear on site.

After your performance

All equipment and instruments must be removed from the stage and transported back to the hotel, as there is limited storage on site. We require one band member to accompany the gear back to the hotel (we recommend assigning this person in advance).

MEDIA

CD and Merchandise Signing

After your performance, if you are scheduled for a CD/merchandise signing, head to the **WOSTore** (you must stay for 30 minutes). All your products should be with us in advance and we will have them ready for you at the store for sale. If you haven't yet provided us with your CDs/merchandise, then please give this to the minder ASAP.

The **WOSTore** is located in the Global Village

Media Interviews

You may have pre-arranged media interviews while on site at the **Media Centre**. Please check your scheduled interview time and ensure that you are on time. If you are unsure where to go, talk to your Artist Minder.

ON-SITE ACCESS

NO WRISTBAND, NO ENTRY – *please check you have the right number of wristbands & artist passes for your group.*

In this Artist Pack you should have all the wristbands you need for your group and artist passes. The wristband will get you on site and the artist pass will give you access to backstage areas and the Artists' Lounge.

Backstage Area

Unless otherwise arranged, you will only have access to the backstage dressing room 1 hour before your performance and 30 minutes after your performance. You may not bring in and/or remove any food or drink (including alcohol) from the backstage area.

Artists' Lounge

The Artists' Lounge is a nice chill-out area for artists to relax in and is located on-site behind the Brooklands Stage. The Lounge is a licensed bar with a seated area that is operational for the duration of the event (payment by cash or card). BYO (bring your own) alcohol is not permitted on site and, if found, will be confiscated. All artists must wear their Artist Pass to gain access to this area. If you have any further questions, talk to your Artist Minder.

The Artists' Lounge is open from 16.00 on Friday 15th March until 23.00 on Sunday 17th March.

APRA SONG LIST - MUST BE COMPLETE

Please make sure you have given your completed APRA song list to your Artist Minder before your first performance. This is extremely important so you can be paid royalties.

The Australasian Performing Right Association (APRA) collects and distributes licence fees for the public performance and communication of musical works within New Zealand and Australia.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Security

The festival has 24-hour security; however, we ask you to always be careful with your valuables. WOMAD takes no responsibility for lost or damaged items.

Zero Waste

WOMAD NZ is a Zero Waste event. All crockery, cutlery and cups are made of materials that break down and become compost. Please respect the park and use Zero Waste bins located on site (see map).

Money

There are **NO** ATMs (cash machines) located on-site! We recommend getting cash out before heading on-site. Most ATM's/cash machines in New Plymouth will accept major bank credit/debit cards issued by Visa/Mastercard. Ask at your hotel for the nearest ATM available.

Smoking

Please note that New Zealand Law forbids smoking in hotel rooms, lobbies, cafes, bars, restaurants, clubs, public transport, and taxis. The festival site is also Smoke-Free, except for designated smoking zones.

Alcohol

You must be over 18 years old to buy alcohol in New Zealand. Note that in the Artists' Lounge you are not allowed to bring in your own alcohol and, if found, it will be confiscated (there is a fully licenced bar in this area).

Drugs

Many drugs are considered illicit drugs in New Zealand and the use and possession of marijuana are illegal.

WIFI

Available onsite, including in the Artist Lounge. Access details will be available in your itinerary and onsite.

Health, Safety & Security Information

To ensure that your experience is enjoyable and hassle-free, please read the following pages containing important information to assist you during WOMAD NZ.

WOMAD STAFF AND DIRECTIVES

Whilst on site you are required to follow instructions given by WOMAD site management at all times. You are entirely responsible for ensuring that you comply immediately with any directions issued by WOMAD staff in the execution of their duties.

The Stage Managers have supervisory control of the stage area and the Artist Liaison Managers have supervisory control of the back stage area including dressing rooms.

Staff will introduce themselves to you in backstage areas. Staff and volunteers will be identifiable by official WOMAD passes and lanyards.

FESTIVAL SCHEDULE

The tour manager will be provided with a briefing before the event which will include health and safety procedures, how to reach the site and a map of the site showing artists' entrance and stage. An itinerary of what is happening; site access times, sound check and dressing room times and performance times will also be provided. Information about specific security arrangements and specific artists areas will be made available.

SECURITY

Security and insurance of personal items are the artist's responsibility. Security will be on site throughout the duration of the event however WOMAD takes no responsibility for goods lost, damaged or stolen.

Security will also remove any alcohol taken from the backstage area by any artists.

ACCESS AND PASSES

Access to the WOMAD site is gained with a WOMAD wristband. These wristbands are to be worn at all times. Wristbands cannot be exchanged or given to another person. No wristband = no entry, there are NO exceptions to this rule. No vehicles are permitted onsite in the festival area unless in an emergency or previously arranged with management. Artist passes must be worn and shown in order to enter backstage areas. Artist passes will also give you access to the Artists Lounge and VIP area.

EMERGENCY STOPPAGE

If a situation arises that necessitates the stopping and/or cancellation of the event, then the decision to do so shall only be made by the Technical Director and Site Operations Manager in consultation with the TAFT CEO and Security Manager.

Once the decision has been made the audience will be advised via the event sound system and event personnel as directed. Ongoing consultation with relevant personnel, including media, shall continue until the event recommences or is cancelled and will continue until the audience has cleared the area and departed the site.

If a performance is stopped and then recommences it will still run to schedule and conclude as per the programme.

ARTIST SHUTTLE VEHICLES

All authorized vehicles are advised of limited speed and on site traffic requirements on site prior to event both in their contract & in written notes distributed with their site passes. There is a speed limit of 7kms – walking speed. There is signage to advise of limited speed. Artist Vehicles have access to site at Bowl Stage and to Brooklands Drive/Kaimata street entrances. Please take care when embarking and disembarking the artist shuttles. Shuttle buses, supplier vehicles and golf carts will be moving on site so be aware of this.

TEMPORARY STRUCTURES

Many stages and structures will be in place – there could be protrusions etc... so please take care when on or around these structures and assess any possible hazards. Take note of any signage and hazard boards.

ELECTRICAL

There will be a lot of temporary electrical installations, especially on-stage and backstage. Be aware of cable runs, temporary electrical outlets, generators etc. Please notify the Stage or Backstage Manager if you have any concerns.

NOISE

Volume from stage events can cause damage so if you are near a stage please ask for & use ear plugs.

ENVIRONMENTAL FACTORS

Some surfaces are uneven or could be slippery when wet. Please take care navigating steps and steep hills and when generally moving around the site. Drink water so you don't dehydrate, wear sunscreen and a hat if you're outside, wear comfortable clothes, appropriate shoes and take care of yourself.

ACCIDENTS AND INCIDENTS

All accidents or incidents are to be reported immediately to the Artist Liaison Manager Whitney Wilson who can be contacted on 0273 600436.

IN THE EVENT OF AN INCIDENT OR ACCIDENT A FIRST AID CREW WILL BE ON SITE AND AVAILABLE FOR ASSESSMENT AND TREATMENT OF ANY INJURED PERSON. PLEASE NOTIFY THE ARTIST LIAISON MANAGER AS SOON AS POSSIBLE.

Pōwhiri – Traditional Māori (indigenous) Welcome

Date: Thursday 14th March

Time: Start 16.00 – 19.00

Location: Muru Raupatu Marae, Te Arei Road, Bell Block

A pōwhiri will be held by the local people of Taranaki (tangata whenua) to welcome our WOMAD visitors (manuhiri). A representative from the marae (sacred meeting place) will greet the visitors and explain the pōwhiri process before the visitors are welcomed officially onto the marae.

The pōwhiri is a memorable and moving experience not to be missed. It will be followed by an impromptu performance and the most beautiful NZ Maori traditional feast (Hākari). We take pride in our culture and encourage our visitors to enjoy the hospitality of our Taranaki whanau (family) while staying here.

Please find attached additional information regarding the pōwhiri process.

Shuttle Buses:

Departure to event: 3:00pm – buses depart from hotels – PLEASE DO NOT BE LATE

Return from event: 7.30pm – buses will return guests to their hotels

If you are interested in learning some Māori language, please check out the WOMAD NZ App.

The pōwhiri is an important traditional welcome ceremony. In former times when tribes met this was when we reconfirmed our connections and maintained our kinship ties. Where we came face to face to talk and celebrate.

Today the pōwhiri, while more ceremonial, still maintains the same process and is also about acknowledging and settling our visitors spiritually and physically into our homeland. We are a proud people who have strong links to our mountain, our rivers, our land and our sea.

The ceremony is conducted in our native language and includes oratory, song, chant, dance and haka. There is an opportunity to respond in your own language and reciprocate with your own song and dance.

The purpose of this ceremony is to become united on the event that has brought us together in this case, WOMAD 2024.

Come with an open heart and mind and let us join together in friendship and celebration of who we are and where we are from.

Please **NO SMOKING on the marae**, only outside where the buses park. **NO PHOTOGRAPHY INSIDE any of the houses**, outside is permitted.

Pōwhiri Process

- Upon exiting the bus at Muru Marae please gather together on the lawn
- You will be briefed, please remain where you are until you are instructed to move
- A karanga (womens call) will occur. The host karanga calls first. This is the signal for the visitors to move onto the marae. This is also the invitation for the karanga from the visiting party to respond in kind. The karanga through their calls acknowledge each other, their groups (hosts and visitors) and where each other is from.
- Slowly move forward after the leaders of the group

- A Haka Pōwhiri (War dance of welcome) will occur. This is done through chant and actions. The local tribal community perform a war dance to proclaim their role as hosts and guardians of this land.
- Then the visitors move further forward to start Hongi (Pressing of noses): The visitors are invited to hongi to join physically with the home people. This process can take a while depending on how many home people there are.
- After this you will be invited to sit either on the lawn or if wet inside the Whare meeting house
- Then the Whaikōrero (Oratory) commences: The hosts will begin the formal order of speaking and will be followed by an orator from the visitors to speak on your behalf. This part is performed by the men and will be all in te reo Māori (Māori language).
- After each speaker a Waiata (Song or chant) will be sung: Each speaker is supported with a waiata at the conclusion of their address. Our waiata speak of the histories of our people. If you speak you are expected to sing or dance.
- A representative for the visitors will speak to formally respond to the welcome
- The host speaker will then close the speeches down with a prayer to finish the formal part.
- The opportunity is then made for you as visitors to respond in your language and with your song or dance. This is less formal so both men & women can take part. Please move to the front of the house to do this – **We strongly encourage you do this as it is a highlight of the pōwhiri**
- Kai (food): The hosts then invite the visitors to dine with them, the kai concludes the pōwhiri where we can eat and share food and stories together.

Visitors Guide to Taranaki

Places to Eat, things to do around town, important numbers and other information.

Devon Street is New Plymouth’s “Main Street” and home to several excellent restaurants, cafes & Bars. These offer a variety of cuisines. Options are available for eating in or take away.

Recommended Restaurants/Cafes

Thai Chefs Restaurant – Thai Restaurant serving classic & vegetarian menus, cocktails in an easygoing atmosphere.

Liardet Street Projects – Communal courtyard of food trucks and stalls, offering a wide range of authentic street food.

Wild Pear Kitchen – Plant-based café kitchen. Offering fresh, flavorsome super-foods.

Elixir Café – contemporary Kiwiana café. With great coffee and it’s uniquely “Kiwiana” food and flair, this is a popular eatery for breakfast, lunch and dinner.

Chaos Café – They have delicious coffee and a fabulous selection of savories and sweets, with a scrumptious lunch menu that changes daily, including tasty vegan, vegetarian and gluten-free meals.

Sushi Ninja – Japanese Restaurant – offering a fresh tasty menu for both lunch and evening dining.

Arborio – Modern Italian influenced cuisine – Open 7 days/nights, not only a beautiful menu but Arborio offers fabulous views of the coastal walkway and ocean.

Nice Hotel and Table – European fine dining on Brougham Street is an elegant restaurant in an award winning boutique Hotel. They provide delicious meals with a bit of flair. They are open from 4pm everyday but you will need to book.

Salt Restaurant – Located across the road from the wind wand with unrivalled sea views from all tables, Salt is the venue for breakfast, lunch & dinner or simply for coffee, a light meal, or leisurely drink. Get comfortable in the lounge area before moving to your table inside or bask in the sunshine on the large balcony.

Social Kitchen – A comfortable bistro that celebrates a social occasion and shared dining in a cozy environment. The Mibrasa charcoal oven allows the chef to cook authentically, retaining the natural flavours

Recommended Bars

Frederics - bar and food – stay downstairs for a drink or head upstairs to Meat & Liquor, Specialising in prime cuts of meat from sustainable farms which have been carefully considered for flavour, texture and agriculture.

Shining Peak Brewing - bar and food – Shining Peak is a Taranaki craft brew pub and eatery. Serving up the freshest beer and world class food.

Three Sisters Brewery – bar and food – producer of craft beer in Taranaki. Relaxed environment for a drink or bite to eat.

Snug Lounge – bar and food – a sophisticated cocktail lounge featuring Japanese Yakatori. Relax in the exquisitely decorated cosy indoor area complete with open fire, or have a drink in the sheltered outdoor bar area, also with an open fire.

Ms White Pizza – bar and food – casual pizza dining experience, also serving Taranaki & New Zealand craft beer.

Things to Do Around Town

You may not have too much spare time, but New Plymouth offers many unique experiences - you just need to know where to look!

If you only have an hour or so to spare.....we suggest you head for:

Pukekura Park: A beautiful place to relax, wander and check out the native flora! Walking distance from the city.

Kina NZ Design & Art space: This shop and gallery located on Devon St West (the clock tower end) is definitely worth a visit for those interested in designer-made glass, ceramics, jewellery, textiles, wood and metal, native paua products and NZ art. Take the credit card!

Art Haus: This shop is located at 62 Devon St West and is packed with quirky and unique New Zealand art pieces, designer jewellery, hand crafted items and sculpture. Phone: 769 6450

The Foreshore and Walkway: Head towards the sea across the railway line and just walk! Head left and you will eventually hit Port Taranaki. Head right, and you weave your way along the Coast to East End Beach. Don't forget to take a jacket and enjoy the Wild West coast on this outstanding coastal walk.

Puke Ariki: Puke Ariki makes up our local museum and library. This is the perfect place to spend a while learning about this country, it's history, people and unique culture. With featured exhibitions, there is also the visitor information centre on the ground floor. This beautifully designed building is opposite the tall, swaying sculpture "*the Wind Wand*" on the waterfront by New Zealand kinetic artist Len Lye. Anybody should be able to direct you in the right direction.

Taranaki Thermal Spa: The perfect place to unwind, soothed by the heated water from this underground spring, private pools are available. About a 5 minute taxi ride from the center of town. 8 Bonithon Ave Ph (06) 759 1666

The Len Lye Centre: Taranaki's world class contemporary art gallery, showcasing the kinetic work of Len Lye. The building itself a work of art, in shining stainless steel. Be sure to check it out at night time.
